

3. KARUNA NIWAS PRE-PRIMARY, MANSAR:

“A good teacher must know how to arouse interest of the pupil in the field of study”. Dr. Radha Krishna. The tragic situation prevailing all over the world due to covid-19 pandemic has affected educational institutions. As a result, during the academic year 2021-22 very few students have taken admission in Nursery KG-I and KG-II, there was no physical classroom teaching. Our concern was that students should not lose their touch with studies so we started online classes. 5 students from nursery, 28 from KG-I and 55 from KG-II attended the online classes. As the children are small only parents who understand the importance of the studies and who have the mobile facilities helped the children to attend the online classes. After the explanations of the lesson, home work was given to the students. In turn after completing the home work they send back to the teachers and teachers corrected the home work on every Saturday in the school and returned to the parents. This procedure went on till first semester. We took on 18/10/2021 to 29/10/2022 and the result was given. For the second semester we call the parents in the school and gave the question paper and asked the parents to submit in the school for correction. Date was 4/4/2022 to 12/04/2022. This was done to improve the writing skills of the students. Oral exam taken through video call. Result was declared on 29/04/2022. We hope that the situation will be better during the next academic year.

Online Classes



4. MARIA BHAVAN NURSERY, KG1 & KG 2

2021-22 there was a lockdown in this academic session due to which it was decided to take online classes. In our school we had decided to take online classes from Google meeting. Teachers

were coming to school and keeping social distance. We had Google meeting along with our Head mistress and teachers. We started Google meeting from 09.07.2021 on 09.07.2021. We had discussion with parent's teachers and Head Mistress to inform the parents about the Google meeting. How do we teach children? As all, we had February and March daily classes with social distance, mask and hand sanitizing. It was very successful and parents were very co-operative. This is the way we ended our academic year. And the result was declared by beginning of April.

Though pandemic did not allow us to open the nursery, we started our little help to deserving students by giving coaching classes on different subjects. We were not able to go and visit the sick in the families we were keeping continues contact with them through phone and counselling. In emergency we visited those who are alone in the house.



We also supported some of the needy families by sharing what we were receiving from different NGOs and



families. In the month of October, we started to visit some of our village groups such as ladies group children's group etc. We also conducted some of the awareness programmes in the villages. Many of them attended and happy about it.

It was an eye opener for them in the midst of this pandemic struggle to go ahead with courage. As we were visiting and meeting the people in their families, we could see many of them were in depression as some of them lost their dear ones due to pandemic. Some of them were struggling for their daily needs like food and medicine as the family members lost their jobs due to pandemic. We informed some of the NGO's and they extended financial help to the needy families. We also made survey of those who did not get the Vaccination and informed the NGO's who helped them to get free Vaccination.



Children bored with the online classes and gadget playing took chance to come to our play ground to play. It was an opportunity for us to be with the children for sometimes in the evening and sharing their laughter and humour.



In the month of March, we visited some of our benefactors in Koliwada, who share with us their catch of sea food now and then. We also attended in the inaugural function of one of our friend's ship preparations and launching to the sea.



We had the celebration of women's day in our village community hall. We thank God for all the protection and care God has given to us. We also extend our gratitude to all our sisters, benefactors and friends for all their love and support.



MEDICAL :

1. ACTIVITY REPORT OF ASHA BHAVAN NURSING HOME 2021-2022



Asha Bhavan Nursing Home aims to promote the sacredness of life through skilled, person-oriented, quality healthcare for all in loving service. We make prenatal, and postnatal care available for women around our locality. We contribute substantially towards women through curative, preventive, and promotive health care through our ministry of healing to one & all, irrespective of caste, colour, or creed at a reasonable cost. We provide obstetric, gynaecological, neonatal, paediatric, and infertility services.

From April 2021 to March 2022, Asha Bhavan Nursing home has served the total number of patients as follows:

Gynaecological OPD – 16211 Paediatric OPD – 3242 No. of deliveries – 772

We utilize 2% of our income for poor patients. This year 44 patients were given total free service and 108 Patients were given 50% concession.

We give utmost care to the ANC patients with regular check-ups and screening.

Pre-pregnancy counselling, Ante-natal check-ups, and Ante-natal detection of foetal abnormalities are provided.



Counselling for infertility:

Counselling is necessary for patients undergoing infertility treatments to ensure that their anxiety and stress levels are not aggravated. The counsellor finds where the problem lies and helps the couple in dealing with it. Based on the screening and report specific treatment methods are explained to them. Regular treatment and follow-up are given to the couples.



Postnatal care of the mother and new born:

Providing medicines at concessional rate



Sickle cell Screening

Sickle cell screening is done at a concessional rate.



Immunization Programme:

The weekly vaccination program for infants and children are taking place in the Nursing home every Wednesday. Many infants from near and far get benefited from this immunization programme.



COVID Vaccination

To help to control the COVID -19 pandemic, the Covid vaccine was made available at Asha Bhavan Nursing Home.



Awareness Programme and counselling

Awareness programs on hygiene, nutrition, and breastfeeding are conducted to educate and encourage the women to take action to improve their health and their baby's health.



Vaccination, surveillance, and appropriate behaviour are vital to avoid the third wave of the Covid-19 pandemic

Staff, Patient and their relatives were encouraged to take the vaccination, and awareness was given to protect themselves from the coronavirus. Covid vaccination camp; was made available in the hospital premises.

All the staff were provided with protective measures such as PPE kit, N95 mask, Shield, gloves, etc. All the staff has taken a booster dose of the covid vaccine.

A medical and socio-legal camp and awareness programme was conducted at Umri village about 12 km from Mansar on 11th November 2021. Sr Vanita, Sr Lincy Kurian, Sr Joicy, Sr Veena with the help of, Sr Cecily, Sr Asrita, Sr Suchita arranged the programme. Dr Kastoori and Dr Mrunali helped us by their medical competence. About 96 patients benefitted from the medical camp. They were given symptomatic treatment and medication.

2. LITTLE FLOWER HEALTH CENTRE RASEGAON 2020-21

Little Flower Health Center is specialized for Snakebite treatment, it is situated in a village and surrounded by many other villages. Snake bite Patients come from near and far villages and even transferred from other hospitals. Patients are admitted in the health Centre and treated. The people come with lots of faith and confidence of the healing and speedy recovery; Some of the patients has to stay for 6 to 8 days according to the type of the snakes and seriousness. The Centre also is running OPD from Monday to Saturday, a good number of patients are benefited for the common diseases especially skin diseases. The very poor are freely treated for the Snake bite cases even though the injections are very expensive. Most snake bite patients belong to farm workers.

SOCIAL:

ACTIVITY REPORT ASHA KIRAN SOCIAL WORK, RAIGAD 2021- 22

1. **Covid 19 Grain Distribution:** - 128 poor people including physically disabled benefited of this kind gustier. We could distribute the packets which contained: 5 Kg. Rice, 1 kg Toor dal, 1 kg. Chana dal, green grams, 1 kg. Sugar, Green leaves, Masala, Chili packet, powder, 1 kg. Chana, Baiting Soup, 1 kg. Soji.



2. **Katkari Children's day Celebration:** - We were extremely happy along with our children of 12 Katkari wadies The downtrodden poor children of Raigad. 306 Children including (Kishories) youth were the part of days program. We celebrated the day with few games, input sessions on hygiene, Life tree and its challenges, some dances and songs. We also distributed gifts to the wieners. At the end we had hot tea and snacks.



3. **Mahad flood relief Work:** - In Raigad District Mahad Village having 680 population experienced the tragedy that suddenly the river water entered the village washing away nearby villages. Mahad became the victim the rich and the poor became alike having nothing to eat, drink or to wear. We thank God for using us (the community of Asha Kiran) as instrument to reach out to them with our kind service with other generous people & religious group could help out more than 600 people.



4. **Tailoring Training for Katkari youth:** - Among 6 girls 4 Katari girls were enabled to accomplish the residential Tailoring training at Tara center. We were happy to provide them all the items like

cloth, Seizers, thread, needles, Chocks, etc. and other materials in order to complete the 3 months tailoring skilled program.



5. **Katkari Women's Day celebration:** -8th March was a remarkable day for us as our Katkari women from 12 wadies along with wadi prarikas gathered at our centre Asha Kiran. They numbered 322 it was a day of joy, togetherness and enlightenment. Dr. Maithri Patil from PHC Centre spoke about Health & Hygiene, Centre Head Sr. Rekha enlightened them about their personal worth and contribution to the family and the society. Animator of CSA Miss. Ruchika briefed about the rights and facilities of women.



6. **SHG:-** Self Help Group is helped out by giving orders from different churches to prepare Nutrition powder, Nachani Powder, Palak, Nachni and Beetroot Papad, Prowns and Bombel Chatani, Garlic, Mango, Veg. Pickle etc. we provide them clean environment and needed materials, Seeds for Gardening including vessels.

8. **Government Facilities:** - :- we work with other NGO's in order to provide Government facilities like Adhar card birth certificate, Gharkul yojana, caste certificate, niradhar yojna, bank pass book for women, disability help, sanjaygandi yojna, family got cyclone relief help, light meter, death certificate, widhawa pension.etc

2. HOLY FAMILY CONVENT, UNTKHANA - FOR THE YEAR 2021-22

During last financial year 2021-22, we sisters of Holy Family Convent have taken keen interest in extending our help to the needy either in cash or kind and reaching out helping aids through various sources.

- We help the people with medical aid, educational aid and family assistance in various occasions. Sisters Martha and Sherly have visited the patients in medical college and provided them necessary assistance through the help of doctors and social workers.
- Sisters Irene and Sherly had gone to Amravati Government hospital to bring Nagesh Khobragade, one of the orphan's sons who was mentally ill and we treated him in our Home and later on we found that he is suffering from Thyroid Cancer and did his treatment and operated him in Medical.



- We provided primary medical aid to the sick and terminally ill patient who was on the footpath and send them to the Palliative care Unit in Snehaanchal, through the help of Mrs. Indrani who is the councillor in Snehaanchal working in medical College.



- Educational Aid provided to Abhilash Sonwani for MS-CIT.
- we have provided 20 Families ration kits and cloth. They include some of the orphans and physically challenged ex-students and poor.



3. ACTIVITY REPORT OF VISHWODAYA (2021-2022)

Vishwodaya works towards building a just society of love, trust, honesty, integrity and equality by empowering women and weaker sections of the society irrespective of caste and creed. Among the many social activities that Vishwodaya undertakes, education of young girls and empowering of women in stressful situations has strengthened innumerable families in their struggle for a dignified human life.

During the academic year 2021-2022, Vishwodaya worked in Kushinagar slum area in Nagpur and also concentrated in the three villages in Umri, Pali and Ghuksi of Parshivini Tehsil through regular family visits, seminars and awareness programmes. Vishwodaya provided regular home base support for HIV/AIDS patients through supplements with kits and medicines.



The pandemic COVID-19 has severely affected their livelihood due to loss of livelihood opportunities. As a result people go through various difficulties in life. The majority of the people in villages and slum are poor and depend on daily labour for livelihood. Many poor families consisting of widows and single Mothers along with children benefited our service. This year 295 families were provided with ration kits.



During the year 2021-2022 we conducted various skill training programmes: 7 girls for tailoring, 14 women for beauty culture, 10 women for Nursing Assistant Course completed their training successfully., Papad and candle making for women and young girls enabled them to be empowered economically as well as develop their personality and support themselves and their families. We also conducted guided studies for 30 poor and weak students from nearby slum.

The sisters regularly visited the families in Martinnagar, Kushinagar, Snehideep Colony, Lourdmata nagar, Nara, Nari, Sugatnagar, Umri, Pali, Gkuksi, the families of HIV patients and Orphans, families of Self-Help Groups. We extend spiritual, moral, material and psychological help through our presence, accompaniment, guidance and works of charity. This year we have visited nearly 890 families.



4. ACTIVITY REPORT OF AVE MARIA CONVENT PUNJAB (2021-2022)

- Nagpur house of Mary immaculate trust in Punjab is engaged mainly in social activities and Education.
- **“We are not social workers; we are contemplatives in the heart of the world”.**

Punjab communities’ activity report as of April 2021 –March 2022. We are fully involved in social activities, visiting the families in Jalandhar- Chogitti, Gurunanakpura, Lambpind, Transportnagar, in Gurdaspur - Dorgal, Dugri dehra, Chakra, Addi, Khokhar etc. visited the families, through our visits and interventions we could extend emotional, moral, material and financial help to the needy families. we also emphasize the important of education for children, the drop outs and give them tuition classes for the weak students and teaching them hygienic way of life. we had gathering of women in different occasion like Mother’s Day, Women’s Day, Girl child day, Lohri on these occasions they were made aware of government schemes and taught them to approach government office to avail the benefit of bank for their savings. They started small scale income generating activities like beauty parlour, tailoring centre, vegetable cultivation etc. they gained confidence to handle their village issues such as ration card, governments schemes.

Women were motivated and given guidance on livelihood and awareness on covid –19 pandemic virus.

WELFARE CENTRES:

1. ASHA KIRAN PANED, PEN:-

This year we have 13 tribal female children of different age group. Sr. Ingrid the warden in charge of Boarding takes care of their emotional, spiritual, physical and psychological care along with their secular studies. They are studying in Asha Kiran English Medium School. Some of them are Katkari tribal children from the villages, mountains and hillocks of Pen- Raigad area; and the rest of these poor children are tribal Catholics, whose parents have migrated to these areas from Orissa, Bihar & Chattisgad in order to earn for their livelihood. These children are accommodated to our boarding to educate them academically. These children have no facilities for their own education and health care. They are taken care of their all-round development. By suitable time table children are taught time management & importance of time. Most of the time is spend for coaching. Sisters take turn to mind their studies.



There was Lockdown due to Covid-19 Corona Virus. Asha Kiran school was close down. Parents of our boarders were informed about the lockdown. They came to Asha Kiran and took the children. On 16th March 2022 Boarding children went home along with their parents safely.

Prior to breakfast they spend their time in prayer, exercise and yoga.



Co-curricular activities are held once in a month like drawing competition, Hand Writing, memory test competition etc.



Evening hours they have gardening and outdoor games.

2. MARIA NIVAS BOARDING - 2021-2022

The academic year 2021-22 was not same as other years. Due to the continuation of Pandemic, school continued with online classes. The parents of our children realized that their children are not serious about their studies so they gradually returned to Maria Niwas. We had 41 children. They followed the classes online and also physically. As the number of children increased, we requested local donors to help us with mobile, which helped us to provide better facilities for children in their studies. In the boarding sisters conducted extra classes to help them.

We had time-table which helped the children to be disciplined and also to make them aware of importance of time and study in their lives. We had celebrations of birthdays, Diwali, Christmas, Girl child day and so on. To prepare for the annual day of Maria Niwas we had special prayer service conducted by children. We conducted different competitions like drawing, singing, single dance, group dance, handwriting, speech and games etc. Our children were able to perform better as sufficient attention and care was given to them by the sisters.

We are grateful to God for keeping all the inmates and their families' safe during the pandemic. We are also indebted to all those who helped us to provide better facilities to cater for the underprivileged children.

3. MARY IMMACULATE HOSTEL

Mary Immaculate Hostel is under the Management of Convent of Mary Immaculate. The aim of the hostel is one of the mutual affections of trustful give and take and of joy.

In 2021, the hostel was reopened from October. There were 21 hostellers, few went to different colleges, few studied in the providence training college and some studied in the providence school. The students learn the values and happiness of life along the line of duty and the spirit of happiness and cultivate real family spirit.

Hostel provides healthy study atmosphere facilitating and promoting educational standard and value-based life. We focus not only on their academics but also to their spiritual growth. They are guided towards incorporating a sense of responsibility, loyalty, team spirit and healthy competition to become graceful and dignified personalities.

Hostel warden and assistant Warden work with close co-ordination with the manager and supervise the daily affairs of the hostellers. We provide Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner, as well as refreshment to the students. Two girls are appointed to the preparation of delicious and hygienic food and for cleanliness. The students residing in the hostel are required to abide by the rules and regulations of the hostel. The parents are kept informed time to time about the well

4. F. C. REPORT - SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

1. Enfance du Monde-Rayon de Soliel: They have sponsored 50 children during this period in order to help them for their studies.

 - 5 of them completed their studies and found job according to their qualifications and helping their families.
 - One is doing her post BSC Nursing and working in a private hospital. She started to help another girl for her education from her salary.
 - One finished B. Pharm and trying for her higher studies.
 - One finished B. Com and she will continue to do B. ED.
 - One is doing her B Com 2nd year
 - One is doing her D. Ed
 - Four are doing their 12th Education.
 - One is doing her 11th Education.
 - One has written the 10th Exam and waiting for the result.
 - 18 are doing their schooling from their homes. We are helping them for their studies.
 - 12 are staying in Maria Niwas Boarding and doing schooling.
- Five children were helped with mobile phone for their on-line studies.

2. **France Parrainages** is continuing to help one girl for her studies. She is doing her D .ED 2nd Year

3. **Reyon de Soleil de l' Enfant Etranges, Paris, France:** Supporting the children of Maria Niwas Boarding for their education, food and lodging and maintenance. We are continuing to help one boy who is doing his higher studies whose mother is widow and handicapped.

5. ISH – NIVAS – 2021-2022

The main activity of ish Nivas sisters was visiting the sick & needy. Counseling them, helping them financially to buy their medicines. Guiding them for a proper treatment to the doctors & helping them to get concession in their treatment, giving them awareness of different sicknesses such as covid 19, fever, vomiting etc. Helping them to be brave & take proper treatment from the Government hospital. We also visited the families of pregnant women. Giving them awareness of cleanliness, and making them known that there is no difference between boys & girls. We conduct children's classes giving them good moral values. Specially in

- During covid lock down & other season we help the poor & needy by giving them grain & other necessary items for their survival.
- We conduct different activities for children such as acting, singing & dancing to bring out good moral values in children.
- We conducted English speaking classes for women & children to make them competent.
- During our last session we visited many families to settle their marriage and gave the counseling.
- We also worked for youth both girls & boys speaking with them, giving them carrier guidance and talks on good moral values. We took them for different competitions on singing, dancing, and one act play.

We are grateful to the Almighty for all His graces and blessings that we could reach out to the poor and marginalized through our various activities. We are ever thankful to our President Sr. Alice Joseph, her team and all the members of the Trust for their valuable co-operation and collaboration.
