


ACTIVITY REPORT OF NAGPUR HOUSES OF MARY IMMACULATE

**Report from Asha Kiran, Paned**  
**F.Y. 2016 -17**

We are working in Pen and Khalapur Talukas in Raigad District of Maharashtra. We are seven sisters in the communities. We are involved in Social, Educational and Pastoral activities. Below are the details of our activities.

**Areas of work: Women empowerment**

We have 20 Self Help Groups in 10 villages. 500 women are involved in SHG's in Bank savings. Through the SHG's we are making them aware of Govt, schemes and make use of it for Income Generating. They are becoming more confident and are able to handle their Wadis (Village's) issues by themselves such as Ration, Water problem, and Govt. schemes and they are approaching to the concerned departmental Officers for settling their problems such as Gramsevaks, Thalaties, Sarpanchat, Tahasildhar, Food Officer, Tribal Development Officers, Block Development Officers, Banks, and to follow up of their applications. SHG's women are motivated and do the regular savings, some of the SHG's women have taken mid-day meal cooking in their villages, goat rearing, vegetable cultivation etc...



**Educating the Village children**



In 10 villages Supplementary classes are conducted very regularly where children from the age group of 3-14 are prepared in order to pursue primary school education with the help of local teachers, and are aimed at providing additional help to the Kathkari children studying in standard 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> so that they can cope up with the other students in the local Zilla Parishad school. The total no of students are 225 in the supplementary class. The parents are motivated on to the importance of education at the very beginning of the academic year. Due to frequent visits and guidance of our Sisters and teachers the attendance of the students are regular in Z.P. schools.



### Teacher's training:

### **Boarding :**

To cater to the Girl's education Asha Kiran started a girl's boarding. We have 18 Kathkari tribal female children in our boarding. They are studying in Asha Kiran English Medium School and are faring excellently. They are provided a Home away from Home where they are given special remedial classes so that they can cope with the regular schools.






At present we have 480 students studying in our school. Normal syllabus of the State Board of Education with all its extracurricular activities are regularly conducted in our school.

We got recognition and permission from the Educational Department of the Maharashtra state Government to conduct classes up to 10<sup>th</sup> and the Government has made it very clear to us that no Government Grant -in- aid will be sanctioned for the maintenance of the school and its staff.

There were 83 Students in the Bording in 2016-17 from Standard One toTen, belonging to the Age Group of 6years to 18 years. These children are often from very poor families and lower middle class families. Several of them are from broken families and single parented.

All of them study in our Providence Girl's High School. Besides their school curriclam activities, they have different activities in the Boarding in order to develop them in different areas and according to their talents and aptitudes chances are given to develop themselves. Different Competitions are conducted on the occasion of Boarding day Celebration like sports, singing competition, speech, Dance etc...

Students who are weak in their studies are given special coaching by our sisters. They also had one day picnic this year. One day seminar is conducted for their parents in order to bring awareness to them their responsibilities in their children's educations and building a healthy society.

### **Mary Immaculate Hostel**

In our Hostel this year there were 23 students. Majority were doing their teachers training in our DEd College. Some were studying in St. Joseph School, in our Providence Girls High School and other colleges in Nagpur. They are paid attention to not only in their studies, but also for their all round development. Special attention is paid for their character formation and to be better citizens to build a better society.

Once in a year Hostel day is celebrated. On this occasion they are given opportunities to develop their talents by various competitions.

## MEDICAL



Through our medical apostolate we are able to reach out to the poor and marginalized. Our health centers in the villages reach medical aid to the village people who have less medical care due to their poverty or lack of availability of medical facility.

### Out Patient Department

**Asha Bhavan** is a Nursing Home in the city where many poor and lower middle class women get treatment for their Gynaec problems, anti natal and post natal care, Surgeries, Pathology, Pediatric OPD, Immunization program dietary advice during pregnancy collectively and individually, Special physiotherapy during pregnancy counseling of patients and family etc..

### **Little flower health centre, Rasegaon**

Little flower health centre at Rasegaon is well known for the snake bite cases with Anti Snake Venum. Patients from near and far away villages come here for treatment. Most of them are economically poor and marginalized. They are given concession for their treatment.

Besides the Snake Bite treatment, we also have a maternity home. Sisters conduct health education classes for the indoor patients as well as for their relatives. They also are taught first aid for the snake bite, burns, dehydration etc...

Patients often come with the particular snake which has bitten them. So that the appropriate Anti Venum can be easily used for their treatment.
